INFRASTRUCTURE EVALUATION

- ◆ STEP 1: Ensure complete and objective assessment of county infrastructure is available for making equitable decisions on future upgrades and improvements.
- ◆ STEP 2: Work with the county comptroller in order to chart the assessments and expenditures over the past two years.
- ◆ STEP 3: Determine an equitable 5-, 10-, and 20-year work plan that details costs to improve infrastructure. We will commit to those findings so that residents, property owners and business leaders can plan with assurance. So long as it makes district two a better place to live, work, and raise a family.

WHAT WE ALREADY KNOW

- ◆ Significant road improvements are needed throughout District 2. Christine's top priorities are: Orange Blossom Trail through Rosemont, Clarcona-Ocoee, Powers, Apopka-Ocoee at Fullers Cross, Kennedy Blvd in Eatonville, and the Welch-Rock Springs Road intersection.
- ◆ Street lighting is needed in the Hiwassee community near Orange Blossom Trail and Clarcona Road, continuing through South Apopka.

SEPTIC TANKS

- ◆ It is imperative Orange County adds to its website which neighborhoods can be converted from septic tanks to sewer line service.
- ◆ County legal staff must advocate with the Department of Health for more cost-effective replacement septic systems.
- ◆ The County must continue to work with homeowners to reduce nitrogen and phosphorous in their use of fertilizers.

What I'll tell you about infrastructure is that I have the most experience on this issue from serving you on the Orange County School Board. There is a lot of angst, where people feel like they haven't had their fair share. I'll work to create an equitable environment.
