## INFRASTRUCTURE EVALUATION

- ◆ STEP 1: Ensure complete and objective assessment of county infrastructure is available for making equitable decisions on future upgrades and improvements.
- ◆ STEP 2: Work with the county comptroller in order to chart the assessments and expenditures over the past two years.
- ◆ STEP 3: Determine an equitable five, ten, and twenty year work plan that details costs to improve infrastructure. We will commit to those findings, so

## WHAT WE ALREADY KNOW

- ◆ Significant road improvements are needed on Orange Blossom Trail through Rosemont, Clarcona-Ocoee, Powers, Apopka-Ocoee at Fullers Cross, Kennedy Blvd in Eatonville, and Welch and Rock Springs.
- ◆ Street lighting is needed in the Hiawassee community near Orange Blossom Trail and Clarcona Road, continuing through South Apopka.

## SEPTIC TANKS

- ◆ It is imperative the County add to their online website on septic which neighborhoods have sewer conversions available.
- ◆ County legal staff must advocate with the Department of Health for more cost-effective replacement septic systems.
- ◆ The County must continue to work with homeowners to reduce nitrogen and phosphorous in their use of fertilizers.
